Update Regarding Cobb County Facility

Sterigenics released the following statement regarding the status of its facility:

"As previously disclosed, the commissioning of the enhanced emission control systems at the Sterigenics facility was nearly complete prior to Cobb County's demand to halt that work in early October pending a fire and building safety review. Sterigenics and the County have been in ongoing dialogue and the County approved the work to complete the adjusting and balancing of the systems that has occurred since its demand was issued in October.

"On February 20, Cobb County affirmed it had previously granted Sterigenics approval to test the negative pressure portion of the emission control systems, consistent with the company's Consent Order with the Georgia EPD. That testing would not involve the use of ethylene oxide and operations at the facility remain suspended at this time. Sterigenics is committed to continuing to comply with and outperform laws and regulations regarding its operations. The company will work closely with state and local officials to complete the requested testing and reviews, including the fire and building safety review required by Cobb County, and to resume the safe sterilization of vital medical products and devices at the facility."
